

# URBAN HEAT AMENDMENT TO PENRITH DEVELOPMENT CONTROL PLAN 2014

FACT SHEET

Council is exhibiting a Draft Amendment to Penrith Development Control Plan 2014.

Development Control Plans are documents that supplement Local Environmental Plans with more detailed planning and design guidelines. Council and our community want a well-planned, balanced City that is liveable and meets the housing and lifestyle needs of our diverse and growing population. This amendment seeks to further achieve this through controls that consider the impact of urban heat as a result of development.

As our City grows and becomes more urbanised, reducing and removing heat from the urban environment is critical to achieving an environment that has high amenity, provides opportunities for active, healthy and safe activities and is comfortable throughout summer.

The proposed amendment will introduce a new Urban Heat chapter into the Penrith Development Control Plan (DCP) 2014. This work is consistent with Council's adopted Cooling the City Strategy and Local Strategic Planning Statement.

The controls have been developed as part of an Urban Heat Planning Controls Package and act to support the *Mitigating the Urban Heat Island Effect* Planning Proposal that is being exhibited at the same time.

The proposed Urban Heat chapter will apply to development located in

the following land use zones as detailed in the Penrith Local Environment Plan (LEP) 2010 Land Use Table:

- All residential zones;
- All business zones;
- All industrial zones;
- All special purpose zones;
- All recreation zones;
- RU5 Village zone; and
- C4 Environmental Living zone (previously known as E4).

These controls will focus on the following considerations:

### **COOLING WITH LANDSCAPING**

This section includes further requirements for landscaping to include elements that contribute to cooling, controls to support the retention of existing established trees and controls to support new trees, such as tree numbers, species, irrigation and soil volume.

### COOL COLOURS AND MATERIALS

This section includes controls for roof colour and material selection to reduce heat absorption and increase reflectivity.

# COOLING THROUGH BUILDING DESIGN

These controls focus on ensuring buildings have adequate air circulation and incorporate passive design principles to contribute to cooler buildings and reduce reliance on mechanical heating and cooling.

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### OPTIMISING MECHANICAL HEATING AND COOLING

This section provides controls to ensure mechanical heating and cooling systems are positioned to reduce the unintentional heating of private and public spaces.

# NOTIFICATION AND ADVERTISING

Council's Community Engagement Strategy (CES) and Community Participation Plan (CPP) have been developed in accordance with the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979. The public exhibition of the draft Urban Heat DCP 2014 amendment has been undertaken in accordance with the requirements of the CES and CPP.
